- we provide school scholarships which cover the cost of school fees, books, supplies, uniforms, and after-

school tutoring

- we provide health care services and nutritional snacks
- we provide library services, including computer and music classes
- we provide extra-curricular activities such as story telling, excursions, children's festivals

GAMER COUNSEL: MODERN WARFARE 3 ANNOUNCED

The biggest game of the year was officially announced on May 13th, 2011. The announcement came with a teaser trailer which shows a layout of New York, and you can hear marines talking to each other. The very next day, another trailer about England was shown, this time with British troops talking. Then IW released two more trailers set in France and Germany.

While the trailers only reveal that some events will be taking place in New York, and London, it is the leaked information that tells a lot. Thanks to Kotaku and their sources the game modes, complete story and some multiplayer features were leaked. Of course the game is subject to change since it's still in develop-

ment, but most of the leaked information will be in the game's release.

After MW2's ending, MW3 will open up with U.S. troops defending New York against a surprise attack by the Russians. The campaign is taking place all over the world, and is basically World War 3.

If you haven't seen the reveal trailer yet, go search it on YouTube. The trailer mostly consists of the campaign so if you're looking for multiplayer you have to wait until E3.

The trailer shows some fighting going on in America, France, England, and Germany. Then at the end you hear Makarov say 'It doesn't take the most powerful countries on Earth to start the next global conflict, only the will of just

one man.' The reveal shows some AC-130 gameplay, which I'm excited about.

Lastly MW3 is available for pre-order, and the first 500 000 get a free poster with the pre-order. The game will be released on November 8th 2011.

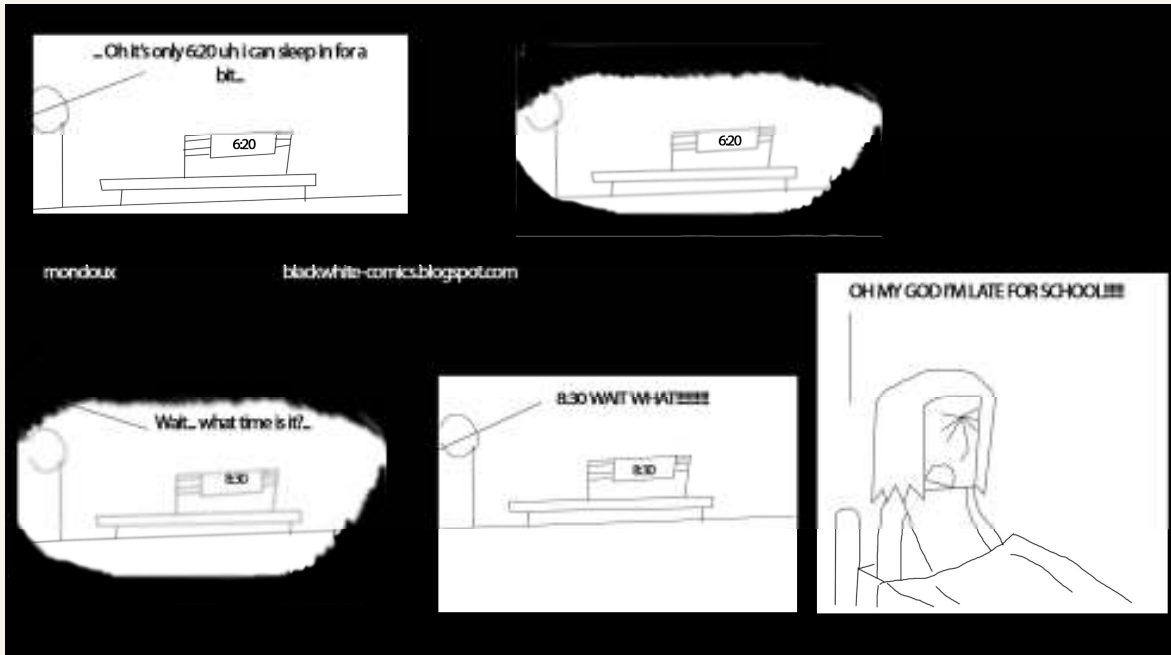
